Introduction

Management and Distribution of Investment Funds in Switzerland are subject to the Investment Funds Regulation, which consists of the Federal Act on Investment Funds and the Investment Funds Ordinances. The Act on Investment Funds is about to being reviewed and its scope being extended in order to englobe various forms of collective investments; the Investment Funds Ordinance has been reviewed in June (for details see below).

The Swiss Federal Banking Commission is in charge of the supervision of the investment funds market; fund companies are subject to its supervision and have to register themselves as well as the investment funds they wish to make public marketing for.

The Swiss supervisory structure is defined in co-operation with and following to the recommendations of the Fédération Européenne des Fonds et Sociétés d'Investissement, the pan-European umbrella organisation of the investment funds industry of the EU member countries and others, such as Switzerland.
